

23 - The Eucharist in Our Lives

Read pgs. 119-120 - take notes on how the Eucharist is the greatest sacrament and how it connects to all the other sacraments.

- All Sacraments are an encounter with Christ, but in the Eucharist Christ is substantially present.



The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life.

How does the Eucharist connect to the other Sacraments?

Baptism: we must first be baptized in order to receive the Eucharist. In Baptism, we first receive the grace won by the sacrifice of Christ made present on the altar in the Eucharist.

Confirmation: gives us an outpouring of the gifts of the Holy Spirit so that we can have a mature faith centered on Christ who is truly present in the Eucharist.

Penance: takes away our sins, so that we can receive the Eucharist with a pure heart and in the state of grace.

Anointing of the Sick: strengthens and cleanses us and prepares us in a special way for heaven, the glory of which is promised in the Eucharist - Viaticum: "food for the journey"

Holy Orders: gives us ministers of the Sacraments - priests who consecrate the Eucharist for the life of the Church.

Matrimony: witnesses Christ's love for His Church, which is made present in the Eucharist (Jesus gives us His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity freely and entirely in Holy Communion)
