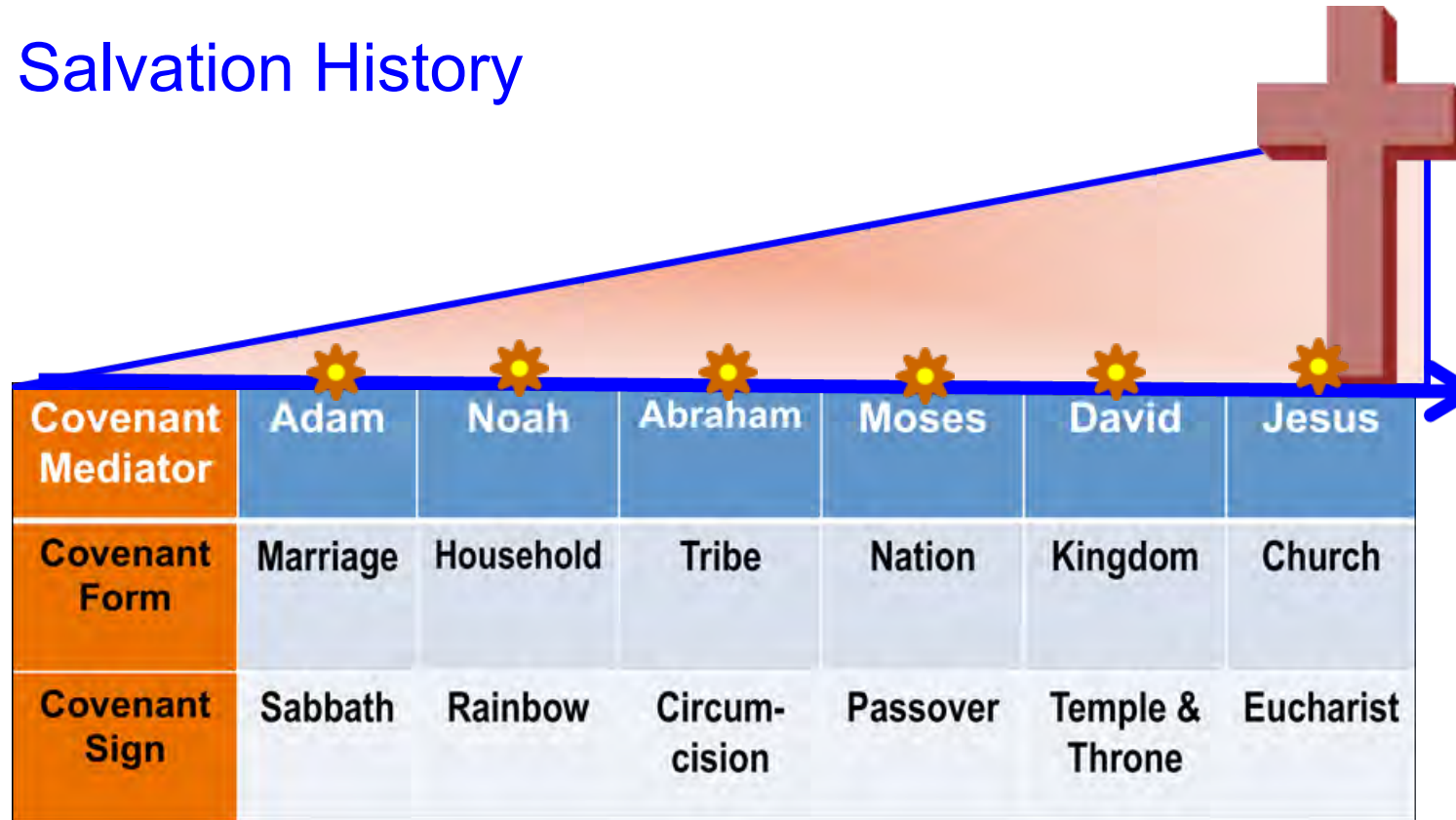

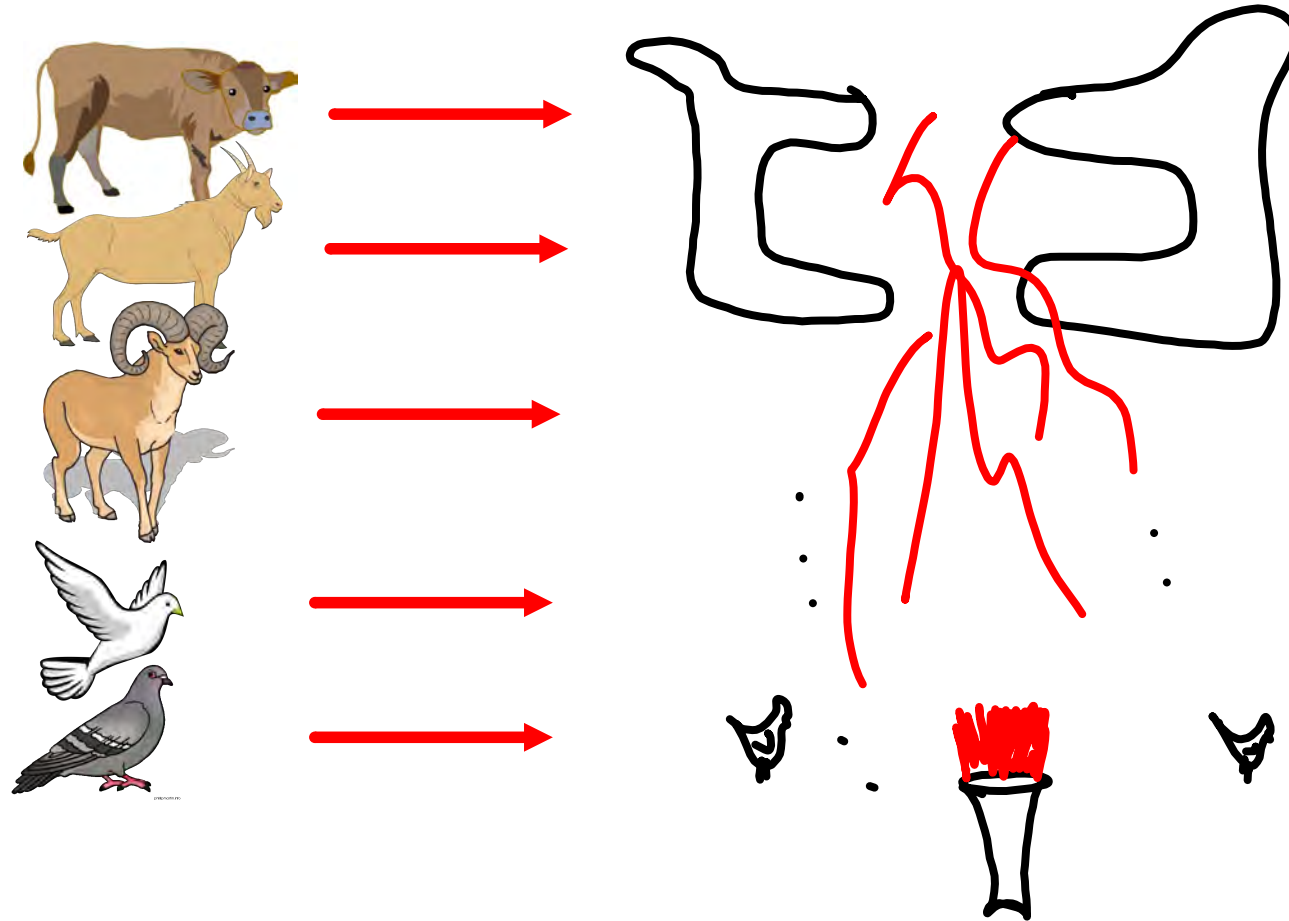

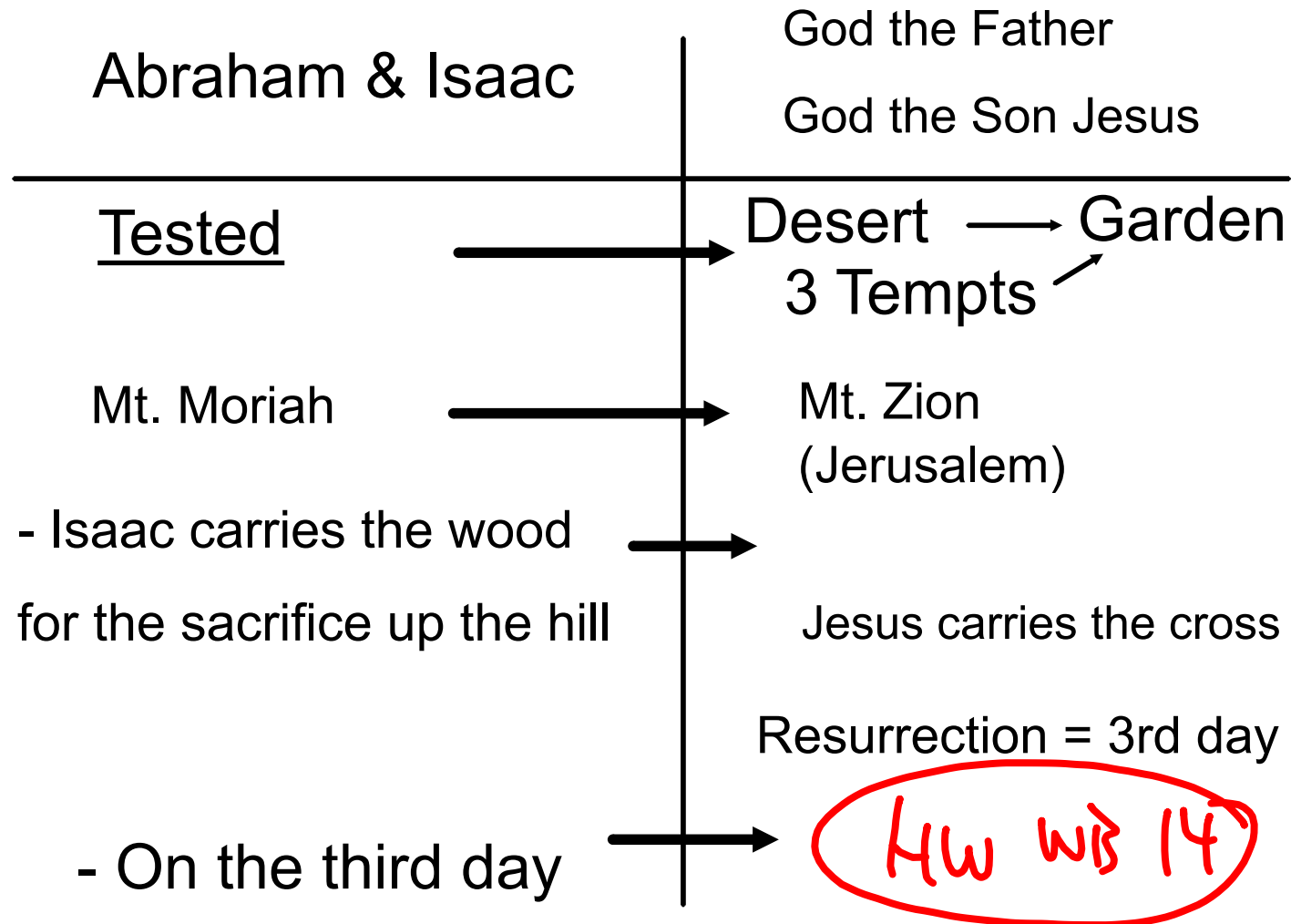

Tested by God	<p>Matthew 4:1-11 Jesus is tempted three times in the desert Matthew 26:36-46 Jesus prays three times in the garden</p>
Mount Moriah	<p>Luke 23:33- Jesus is crucified at the Place of the Skull "Golgotha" or "Calvary". This is part of Mount Moriah range.</p>
Isaac carries the wood -- Genesis 22:6	<p>John 19:17 - Jesus carried the wood of the cross</p>
On the third day – Genesis 22:4	<p>Matthew 17:23 Jesus is raised on the third day Hebrews 11:17-19 Abraham believed in the resurrection</p>
Genesis 22:13 Ram in thicket	<p>John 19:2 - Jesus is crowned with thorns</p>
Genesis 22:15-18	<p>Galatians 3:16 & 29 If you belong to Christ, you are a child of Abraham too</p>

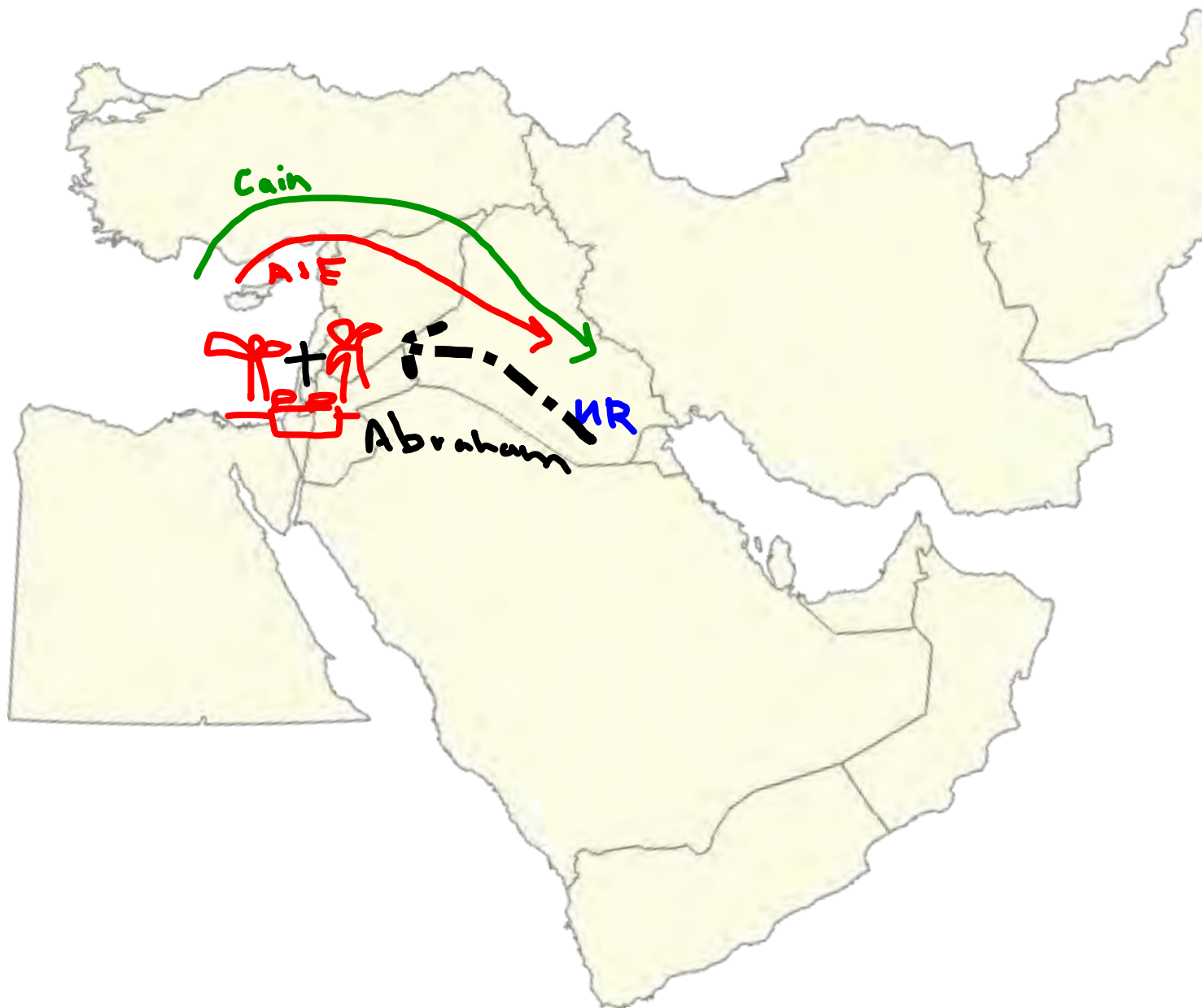

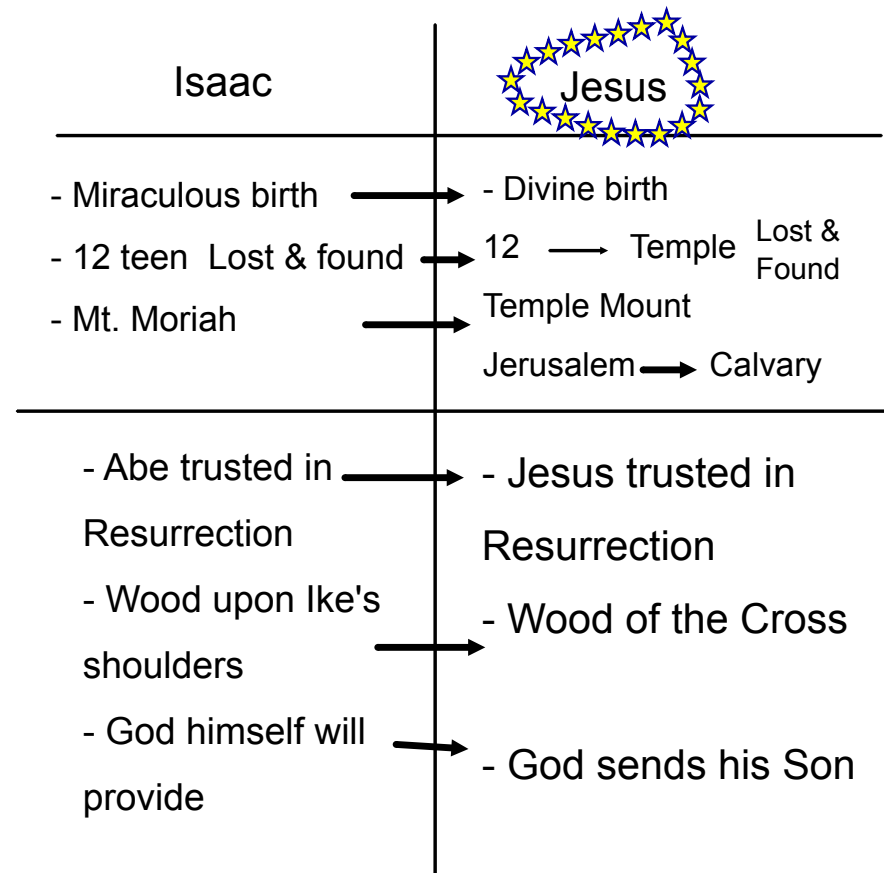

Old Test. Joseph

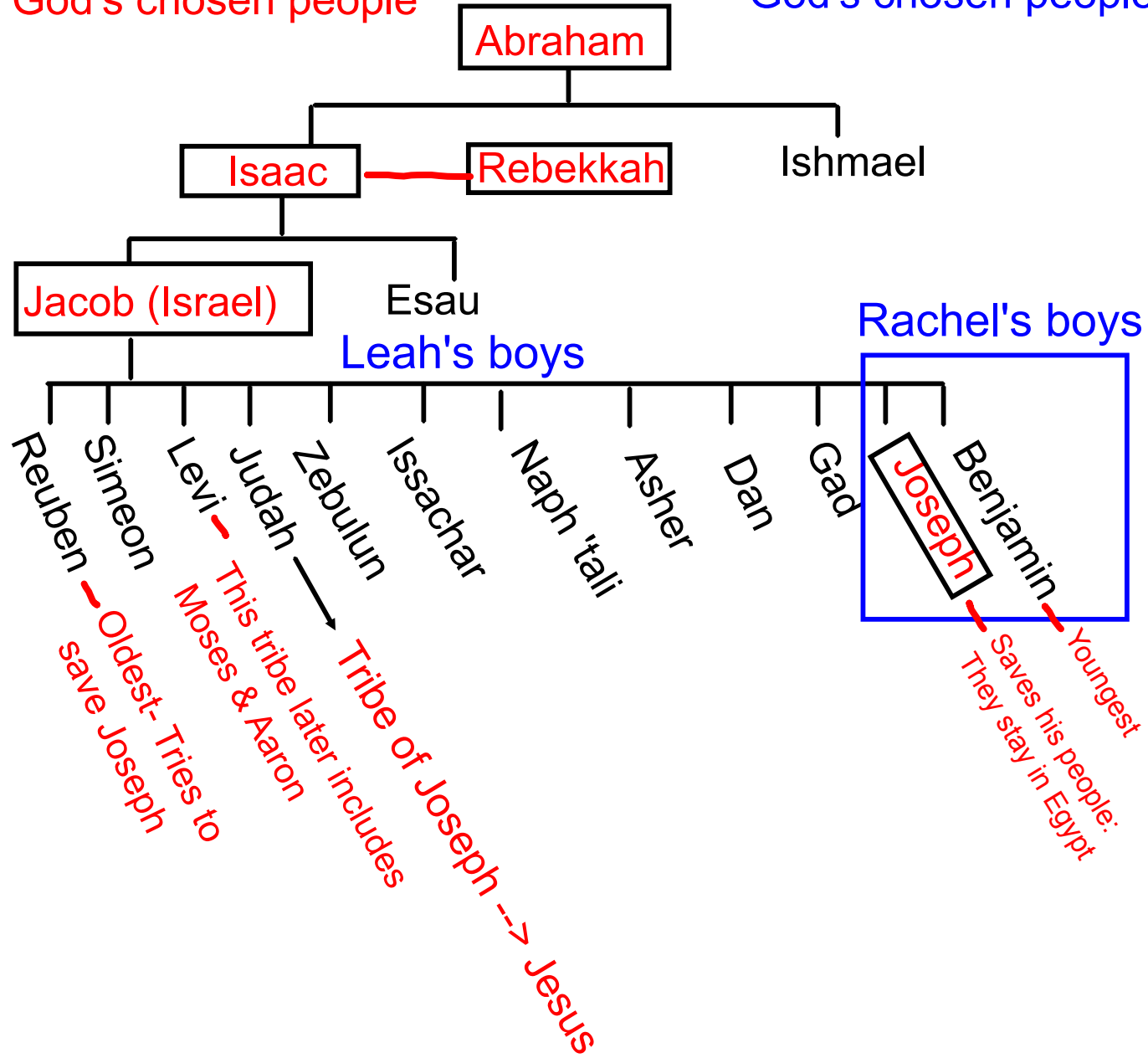
- Rejected by his brothers - left for dead

- Innocent though found guilty
- Raised to new life and power
- Saved people with grain / bread.
- Forgave his brothers/ persecutors

Jesus

- Rejected by people. Betrayed by Judas. Abandoned by his apostles.
- Sold for 30 pieces silver
- Life of service
- Innocent but crucified.
- Resurrection
- Saves us with his Body and Blood.
- Forgives sinners

Matriarchs - Mothers of God's chosen people

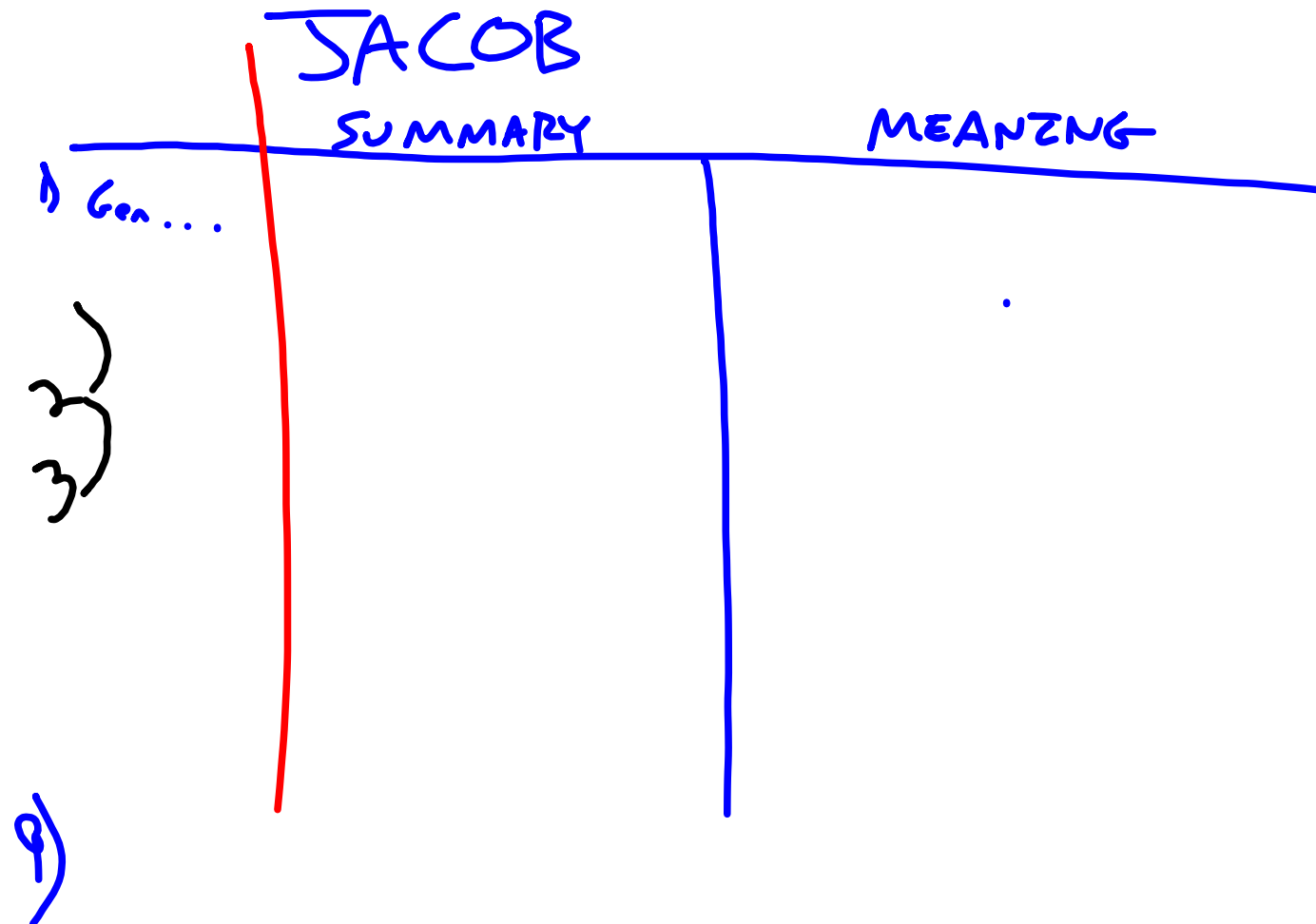

2) Gen 25:27-34	<p>Esau, an outdoors man,</p> <p>sells his birthright because he doesn't care.</p> <p>Jacob serves stew as payment.</p>	<p>Jacob is intelligent but deceptive. God brings blessing from sin.</p>
