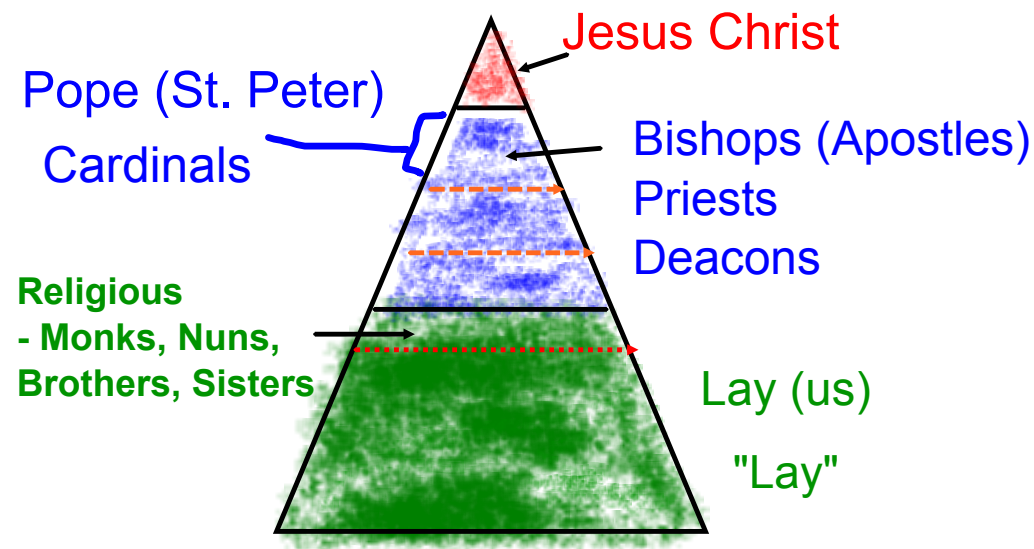


What are the 3 degrees of Holy Orders in the Church?

Pg 32 Hierarchy (Sacred order)



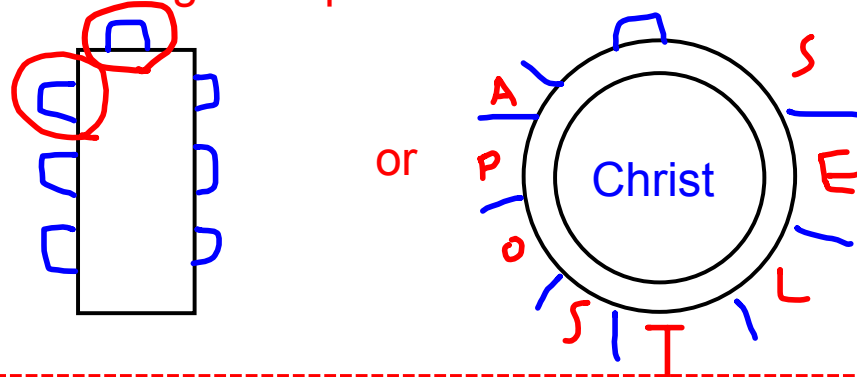
Hierarchy: Jesus gave us a hierarchy in the leadership of the Church --> When he chose St. Peter to lead the Apostles

Pope: Bishop of Rome WKSHT 17

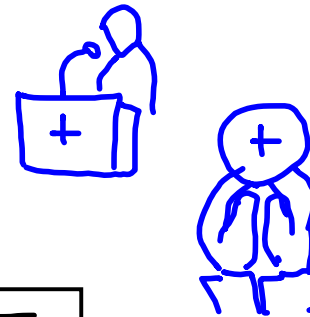

I. Papal Infallibility: when the Pope defines a doctrine "Ex cathedra"

↳ From the chair or the authority of St. Peter

Extraordinary Magisterium ↗

1854 - Immaculate Conception *Dec. 8th*
Mary was conceived without Original sin

1950 - Assumption: *Aug. 15th*
Mary was taken body & soul into Heaven at the end of her earthly life.

Obedience

Catholics must:

1) Obey Church disciplines.

Why? "Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in Heaven..." Mt 16:19

2) Believe in Church doctrines.

Why? "...so that everyone who believes in Him may have eternal life...whoever believes in the Son of Man will not be condemned" Jn 3:15,18

"teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you" Mt 28:20

3) Practice the Church's moral law.

Why? "You are My friends if you do what I command you." Jn 15:14
